



SAMPLE FACILITY MAP

Facilities are required to supply a facility map of their property. This map must include both the outdoor layout (e.g. barn and paddock locations) as well as the indoor layout (e.g. stall map) if the facility has indoor housing. This map may be reused for subsequent renewal of certification, so long as the information in it has not changed.

Outdoor Layout

Please provide an image of the property (hand drawn or other means) and on it indicate the following features:

Paddocks refers to outdoor fenced-in fields or enclosures where horses are kept or exercised (e.g., pens, pastures).

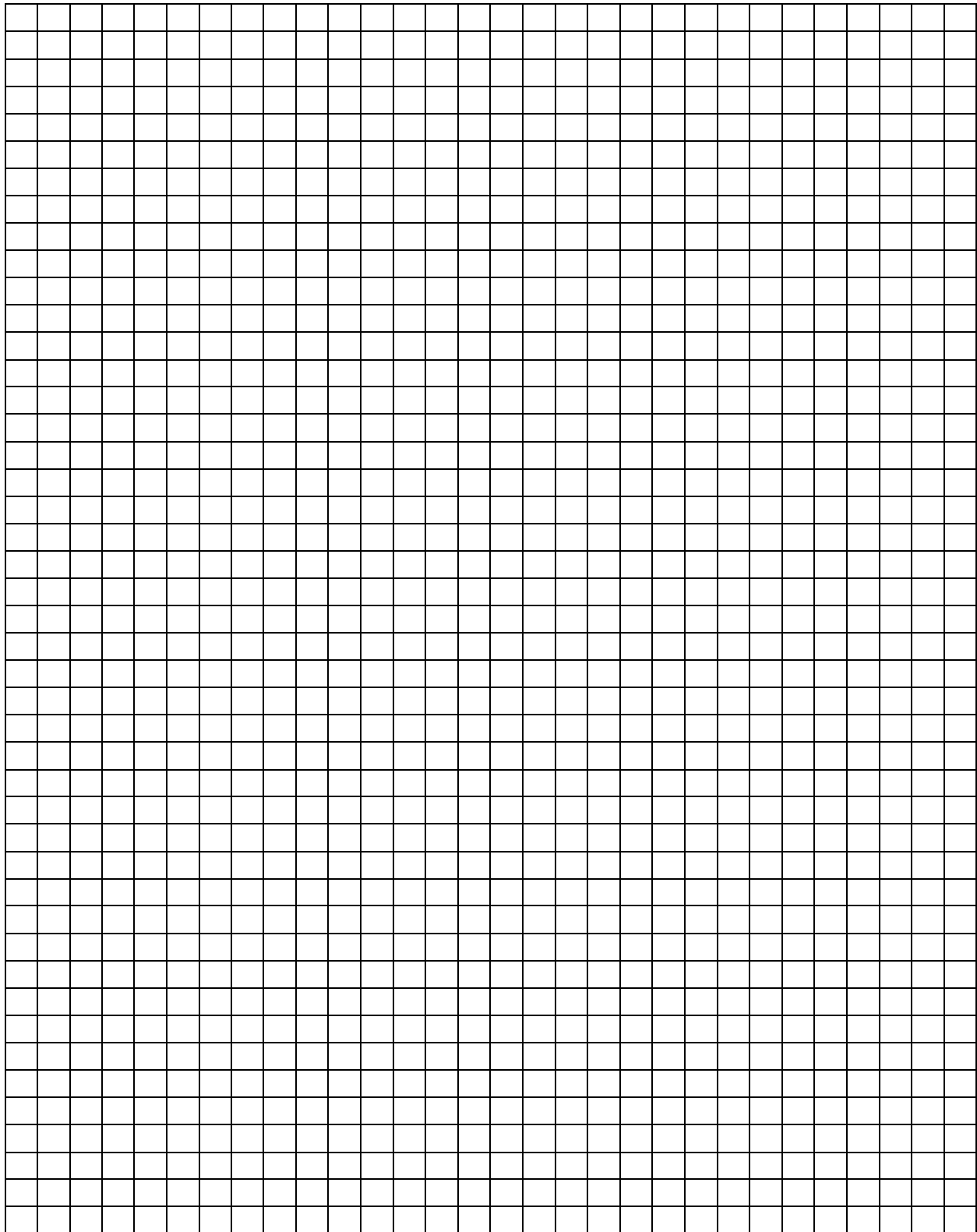
Shelter refers to a natural or man-made structure which protects the horse from inclement weather conditions. An example of a natural shelter is a thick, mature tree line that effectively protects from inclement conditions. Examples of a man-made shelter include a run-in, three-sided shed, or a barn. For constructed shelters, there must be sufficient space in the shelter to accommodate all horses in the paddock at the same time.
